Homemade Frozen Treats

Warm weather is here and our dogs enjoy an "ice cream" treat as much as we do. Why not make them a healthier, less expensive alternative to Frosty Paws. Choose any of the recipes below and just mix and freeze. YUM!

Pumpkin Banana

- 2 bananas
- 2 Tablespoons peanut butter
- 2 Tablespoons honey
- 4 Tablespoons pumpkin
- 24 ounces fat free vanilla yogurt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon

Super Green

1/2 cup applesauce

16 oz frozen spinach, thawed and drained

24 ounces fat free plain yogurt

Apple & Oatmeal

1/2 cup unsweetened applesauce

1 1/2 cup toasted oat

24 ounces fat free vanilla yogurt

1 teaspoon cinnamon

Meat Lover

1 (15 ounce) low-fat vanilla yogurt (or plain)

1 (5 ounce) jar beef baby food (or chicken)

3 tablespoons honey

Uber Orange

1/4 cup pure pumpkin

1/2 cup fresh grated carrot

½ teaspoon ground cinnamon

24 ounces fat free vanilla yogurt

Banana Peanut Butter

32 oz of plain yogurt

- 1 jar of banana baby food
- 2 Tablespoons of peanut butter
- 2 Tablespoons of honey

Fresh Breath

1 mashed banana

- 24oz. plain yogurt
- 2 Tablespoons honey
- 2 Tablespoon chopped parsley
- 2 Tablespoons chopped mint

Big Blue

1/2 cup peanut butter

1/2 cup fresh blueberries

24 ounces fat free blueberry yogurt

Coconut Dream

1 Tablespoon honey

1 cup shredded unsweetened coconut

24 ounces fat free vanilla yogurt

Hawaiian Breeze

8-10 pieces of pineapple

10-15 pieces of watermelon

2 tsp. shredded, unsweetened coconut

1 tsp. honey

- Use 3oz Dixie paper cups to freeze treats in
- Freeze in a muffin tin and stand up a Pupperoni or Milkbone in the middle as a popsicle stick
- Add chunks of dog biscuits
- make with goats milk yogurt for lactose intolerant dogs
- Add blueberries, cranberries, strawberries, blackberries or raspberries for a anti-oxidant boost
- Make an "ice cream sandwich" by freezing mixture between two thin flat dog cookies.
- Add oats for fiber, extra nutrition and protein
- Add flaxseed for omega-3 fatty acids
- Do not make in ice cube trays when giving to large dogs. Choking Hazard.
